Every week our sermon and a few pieces of music go on-line through our Ascension Lutheran Church "You Tube" channel. During 2023 we had a little over 11,000 views, an average of 213 weekly. We have seen quite an increase from our average of 150 in 2022. Two of our weeks saw an unusually high number of views - on February 12 we had 550 views and on March 19 we had 545 views. During the year we have heard from a number of our viewers across the States, and we received correspondence from the Czech Republic and Ethiopia. Many thanks to Mike Zehnder who provides the music and the outline for the service. Special thanks go to Durwin Schmitt and Tim McClaren who videotape the sermon and edit the service for viewing.

During 2023 we saw some positive news and some negative news as we look at the numbers of our congregation. First the positive - we saw our average weekend attendance in worship jump from 195 in 2022 to 220 last year - an increase of 25 worshippers. We saw 9 people transfer into Ascension, we confirmed 7 adults and we had 12 baptisms. But our membership continues to see a decline. In 2022 we had 533 baptized members, but we ended 2023 at 509 baptized members, a loss of 24 folks. Our communicant membership saw almost an identical decline. We began the year with 483 communicant members but ended the year at 458 adult members - a decline of 25. We saw an unusually high number of deaths - 19, we had 10 folks transfer to other congregations, and 15 folks were removed after years of inactivity or moving away from the area. We thank God for His hand in this past year and we ask for His Spirit in what He desires to accomplish in this new year.

Margo Pasha, our treasurer, shared with the Church Council that our congregation was amazingly generous in this past year. We received \$106,000 more than we anticipated, and our boards and committees spent \$38,000 less than their budgets allowed. We had a gain of \$131,000 for 2023. Because of the excess funds received, the Board of Elders will be able to allocate an additional \$9,100.00 in mission funds in their meeting on January 23. Our congregation gives 10% of monies received to our mission partners and mission projects. Thank you for your overwhelming generosity.

<u>This past week</u> we received notice that our sister congregation, St Andrew Lutheran Church in the Montbello neighborhood of Denver, had their final worship service at the end of 2023. St. Andrew's has been serving that neighborhood since 1968 - 55 years ago. It appears that the facility will continue to be used for a number of Spanish speaking congregations. We pray God's peace upon this congregation and the future of each individual's spiritual health and growth.

<u>A first is coming to Ascension Lutheran Church</u> - the GriefShare 13-Week Support Group Program, starting In February and ending in April. The program focuses on relevant grief topics (Examples: Regrets, Secondary Losses, Anger, etc.) associated with the death of a loved one.

The weekly 30-minute videos feature nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people. The videos are followed by small group discussions about what was viewed. Past participants have commented on the immense value of the follow-up

discussions. Grief work is so important to healing and happens when surrounded by others who understand. Experts tell us that it is normal to spend 2-5 years actively working to heal after the loss of a loved one. Confidentiality is very much part of this program. GriefShare is Christian-based but is intended for all grievers - those of faith and those without.

Please consider this program, not just for yourself, but for friends, neighbors, or family members that you think may benefit from encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving; making changes; and finding hope for the future, as well as strengthening spiritual relationships.
