PENTECOST SUNDAY KINDLE IN US THE FIRE OF YOUR LOVE AS WE GATHER

It is the week of weeks—seven times seven plus one, the fiftieth day—when Pentecost arrives. It is the last day of Easter and the first day for the fruits of Christ's Easter victory to be proclaimed to the ends of the earth. Today we discover anew what it means to be united in the apostles' teaching, fellowship, the breaking of bread, and prayer. All things in common, the disciples are gathered to bring the nations together as one people by the Word of Christ's death and resurrection and the faith that apprehends and confesses this saving truth. All of this is enabled by the fire of the Spirit burning in us and through us so that everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.

Prelude "O Holy Spirit, Enter In" Paul Manz

(Worship Notes: The tune of today's Prelude and Opening Hymn, "Wie schön leuchtet der Morgenstern, meaning, "How Lovely Shines the Morning Star," has been called "The Queen of Chorales." It was written by Lutheran composer Phillip Nicolai in 1597 and has been arranged by many classical and contemporary composers from J.S. Bach in his first Cantata BWV 1 to contemporary composer Paul Manz who wrote today's prelude using the tune in a smashing setting of clashing chords and harmonies against constant triplets and double pedals. This almost wild setting evokes the morning sun breaking up the night's darkness (just as the Holy Spirit breaks up the darkness of our hearts and brings us into the light of Christ). The hymn tune, "Wie schön leuchtet," is so popular it is used for five different hymns in our Lutheran Service Book (see page 1016 of your hymnal index) and today's textual version is a prayer for the infilling of the Holy Spirit, appropriate to the season of Pentecost: "O Holy Spirit, Enter In.")

fire of your love.


Pastor: He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will

Pastor: For this holy house and for all who offer here their worship and praise, let



Old Testament Reading: Genesis 11:1-9

(God confuses the languages of the people to preserve them from even greater sin only to have Christ transcend those divisions when He comes.)

Now the whole earth had one language and the same words. And as people migrated from the east, they found a plain in the land of Shinar and settled there. And they said to one another, "Come, let us make bricks, and burn them thoroughly." And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar. Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves, lest we be dispersed over the face of the whole earth." And the Lord came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of man had built. Second Reading: Acts 2:1-21

(Filled with the Spirit, they began to speak in other tongues.)

When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were

bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine."
