<u>The Memorial Service for Jim Adams</u> will be on Friday, June 13 at 11:00 a.m. A meal will follow the service.

<u>The 53rd Convention of the Rocky Mountain District</u> of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod was held at the Marriott South Park Meadows Hotel in Lone Tree, Colorado on May 29-30, 2025. Pastor John and Arvin Michel attended as Voting Delegates from Ascension. About 90 Pastoral Delegates and 90 Lay Delegates elected various people to lead our District in the next 3 years, as well as deciding on various resolutions to grow the church. We also had worship, study, and time for fellowship with one another. The Rocky Mountain District is made up of about 150 congregations from Colorado, Utah, New Mexico and El Paso, Texas.

The President of the LC-MS, Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison was with us, offering an update on the happenings of the Synod throughout the world. He also preached for the closing service of the convention. Our District President, Rev. James Maxwell, was re-elected to his second three-year term. Pastor Jared Melius, pastor of Mt. Zion in Denver was elected as the first vice-president of the District and also our regional vice-president. Pastor John was reelected as the Circuit Visitor for the Denver Southwest Circuit.

A number of resolutions were approved, including:

- The elimination of term limits to the District's By-Laws. To this point the maximum number of years one could serve in an elected position was 9 years.
- ❖ We saw the need to assist the rural congregations in the District. Many of them face financial challenges as well as staffing problems. A resolution to address the needs of rural congregations was passed.
- ❖ The Convention resolved to make the State of Utah, and the congregations that serve there, our special mission project. We set as a goal to raise up to one million dollars to bring the joy of the Gospel to that state.

We also heard reports from the Seminaries and Universities in our Synod and their concerted efforts to train more pastors, teachers and church-workers. We are looking at a large shortage of pastors and teachers in the coming years.

God blessed our convention with great harmony and a strong desire to be God's vessel to bring the salvation of Jesus to the communities where we live.

Stained-Glass Windows at Ascension


The artist, Betty Jane Gaiser White, attended Valparaiso University and the Cleveland Institute of Art. She wanted to praise her Lord by sharing one of the talents He had given her.

This was to be a visual proclamation of what she and her fellow members believe.

She spent two years doing conceptual research and design and one year working with Creative Stain Glass Studio on the fabrication process.

After the original drawings were enlarged and color translations established, each piece was coded by color and placement. They were then cut into templates.

The template is placed on the dalle glass slab, which is sectioned by saw. The final form is chipped by hand. Over 3800 separate pieces are in these eight windows. The pieces are placed in position on the full pattern. An epoxy resin was poured to form the matrix. Each window was then turned over and the second side



poured. A different color of epoxy was used on the second side for the windows to be aesthetically pleasing to the exterior elevation.

Pastor Arnold Voigt encouraged Betty in developing her dream and wrote the window descriptions which accompanies each piece.

A dedication service was held February 2, 1986.
