

Lutheran Valley Retreat (LVR) is a year-round retreat and summer camp facility for all ages, tucked away in the Pike National Forest. They are located 1.5 hours from Colorado Springs and 2.5 hours from Denver. Their mission is to share God's grace and glory through His creation.

<u>From Friday evening, August 1 until Sunday morning, August 3, 2025</u>, members and friends of our congregation will share Christian fellowship and engage in fun, safe indoor and outdoor activities for all ages. We will be staying in cabins; married couples

may request to stay together as space is available. Bath facilities are near the cabins. Meals are served cafeteria-style. There are trailer hook-ups available (20 amp receptacles), as well as tent campsites.

Holy Birth of Christ Jesus – Window

... Was Conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary

Christmas, Good Friday and Easter are part of the total fabric of the tapestry

of salvation woven through the work of Christ. His birth, His death and His resurrection are for us and for our salvation as the Creed proclaims.

The dominant color, blue, is the color of hope and heaven. The descending dove symbolizes the Credal phrase, "He was conceived by the Holy Spirit." The traditional three wisemen, a Caucasian, an Oriental, and a Black, remind us that no one is excluded from God's offer of salvation: "God our Savior...desires all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth". The shepherds in the hills foreshadow the One who calls Himself the Good Shepherd.

The wisemen present their gifts; as the Promise and the Word take root in our hearts, we are moved to respond with our gifts and our talents.

The road to Bethlehem reminds us that we are all pilgrims, seeking the city of our God.
