FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST / INDEPENDENCE CELEBRATION THANKS FOR DIVINE PROVIDENCE AND FORGIVENESS AS WE GATHER

Today's Old Testament Reading is a call to rejoicing for people of faith in Christ. The guaranteed future includes "peace...like a river," a powerful and restful image for Americans who believe in Jesus as their Savior. Today, as we highlight songs of praise for God and Country, we especially rejoice that no matter what the turmoil in our country and world, God has promised His loved ones a future where "there ain't gonna be war no more" and where "the lion lays down with the lamb." With all that is going on in our world today this is a promise worth holding close to our hearts in the midst of our many challenges. Pastor is preaching on Matthew 6:12 which is part of the Lord's Prayer, where Jesus teaches his followers to ask God to "forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors." This verse highlights the importance of forgiveness, both receiving it from God and extending it to others. It emphasizes that forgiveness is a two-way street, something we sorely need to practice in our country rather than the angry rhetoric that so often marks our political discourse. First and foremost, we rejoice that in spite of our shortcomings in this area, we have the assurance that God has already given us what He asks us to freely give to one another.


(Based on Isaiah 54:6-7,10 – God will never leave us or forsake us, no matter what is

Epistle: Galatians 6:1-10, 14-18 (Paul encourages mutual caring and global outreach.)

Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted. Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ. For if anyone thinks he is something, when he is nothing, he deceives himself. But let each one test his own work, and then his reason to boast will be in himself alone and not in his neighbor. For each will have to bear his own load.

Let the one who is taught the word share all good things with the one who teaches. Do not



be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap. For the one who sows to his own flesh will from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit will from the Spirit reap eternal life. 
People: Glory to You, O Lord.

Holy Gospel: Luke 10:1-20

(Jesus rejoices with the disciples as they return with good news.)

After this the Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to go. And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I am sending you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry

no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if not, it will return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages. Do not go from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you. Heal the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' But whenever you enter a town and they do not receive you, go into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near.' I tell you, it will be more bearable on that day for Sodom than for that town.



"Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. But it will be more bearable in the judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you. And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You shall be brought down to Hades.

"The one who hears you hears me, and the one who rejects you rejects me, and the one who rejects me rejects him who sent me."

The seventy-two returned with joy, saying, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us in your name!" And he said to them, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Nevertheless, do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

Sermon

"Forgiving and Forgiven"

Text: Matthew 6:12

Statement of Faith: Catechism The First Article

People: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean?

I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have.
