More symbolism is interwoven in this 7th window than in any of the 8, flowing from top to bottom.

The top 3 circles represent the Trinity, whose work is focused in the Cross of Christ. Christ's work is made present to the Church today through the Word (Bible) and the

Sacraments, note the chalice, and the small loaf of bread on the altar. The seashell, an ancient symbol of life, spills water into the baptismal Font.



From the work of Christ and the Font, grows the Vine with its Branches. Jesus says, "I am the Vine, you are the branches." The Vine winds down, growing fruit which turns out to be persons!

The Church is 'catholic," that is, universal embracing people of all nations, as depicted in various ethnic groups.

Amid His people, we see the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." The banner with the cross symbolizes the mighty army of God marching toward eternity. Left of the Lamb are hands and a cup. This suggests the caring ministry of the Church: "Bear another's burden" and "whoever gives a cup of water because you bear the name of Christ, will by no means lose his reward."
