Resurrection of the Body and Life Everlasting

The palm branches are a near Eastern symbol for life and here remind the Christian of the Life Everlasting that is ours through Jesus Christ. Green is the liturgical color for life. The whole world/globe stands under the grace and judgment of Christ. The angels blow the trumpets, a signal of the call to resurrection. Above the heavens is the Crown with the Cross, echoing the blessed state of the faithful who are redeemed by a King on a Cross: "Be thou faithful until death and I will give thee a crown of life." Rev 2:10. The sun rays, also present in the Creation, Resurrection and Holy Spirit Windows, blend the themes of light and life: "And night shall be no more; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their Light, and they shall reign for ever and ever." Rev. 22:5

The book with the seven seals is a symbol of God's plan for mankind in history; whatever the twists and turns of history, God's plan of salvation for His people will not be thwarted or stopped. Matt 16:18
