Lenten Banners

Purple is the color associated with Lent and signals a time of sorrow, contemplation and repentance – a time to draw near to God. Our Lenten banners tell a story of God coming to earth as man and crucified on the cross. The cross is made of **black** for our sins, with **red blocks** for Jesus' wounds.

The **red ribbon** that flows down and to the top of the next banners is His blood shed for us. The silver ribbon is for the cleansing water from God. These two components flow through cobble stones, like our path we walk through life. The cobble stones are bumpy, uneven, and as unique as our path. Christ flows straight through it as a valuable presence in our personal life, and then encircles the whole world.

The Jerusalem cross, below, has four inset crosses and represents the four Gospels and the four corners of the earth.
