AS WE GATHER

From the very beginning following the creation of humanity, the Lord made His people managers, or stewards, of His good and perfect creation. Even in our imperfect world since the fall into sin, the duty and privilege to manage all God gives is still humanity's role and responsibility. As we strive to faithfully uphold the responsibilities given, we realize it often takes sacrifice. Cain and Abel's offerings caused different responses from the Lord and led Cain to a sinful response. Paul faithfully managed the gift of the Gospel to the ends of the earth to the end of his life, even as he was "poured out as a drink offering" (2 Timothy 4:6). In Luke 18, Jesus calls us to humility in our stewardship and in our service as a faithful response to His grace. Through it all, Christ's sacrifice compels our humble sacrificial living and giving in response to all we have been given.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION *Psalm 32:5; 124:8*

Pastor: Beloved in the Lord, let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins unto God our Father, approaching Him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

People: Our help is in the name of the LORD,
who made heaven and earth.

Pastor: I said, “I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,”

People: and You forgave the iniquity of my sin.

Pastor: Since the fall into sin in the Garden of Eden, humanity has turned away from Your will and ways. We have followed our own selfish desires. From Cain's murder of Abel to Paul's unjust imprisonment for proclaiming and confessing Your name to our own misguided perceptions of self-righteousness in the name of faith, sin has continued to be present in our thoughts, words, actions, stewardship, and lives. Recognizing our

waywardness and sinfulness, we come to You, O almighty God, merciful Father.

People: I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess unto You all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your temporal and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being.

Pastor: Even in our sinfulness, God does not leave us in our fallen state nor give us the punishment we deserve. To a guilty Adam and Eve, He promised One who would bruise the head of the serpent. To a guilty Cain, He gave a mark that would spare attacks on his life. To Paul, a persecutor of Christians as Saul and a converted witness to the power of a living Savior, who faced the wrath of guilty authorities for their attempt to silence the Gospel, He brought him safely to His heavenly kingdom. To the ones guilty of haughtiness and pride, He graciously taught humbleness.

To us, imperfect stewards who are guilty of sins against God and our neighbors, our heavenly Father has had mercy upon us and has given His only Son to die for us and for His sake forgives us all our sins. To those who believe on His name, He gives power to become the children of God and has promised them His Holy Spirit. Therefore, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son of the Holy Spirit.

He that believes and is baptized shall be saved. Grant this, Lord, to us all.

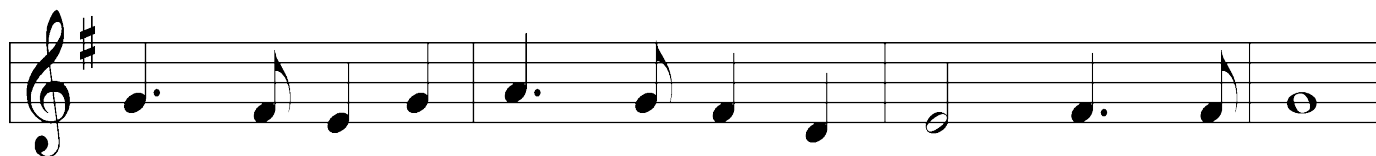

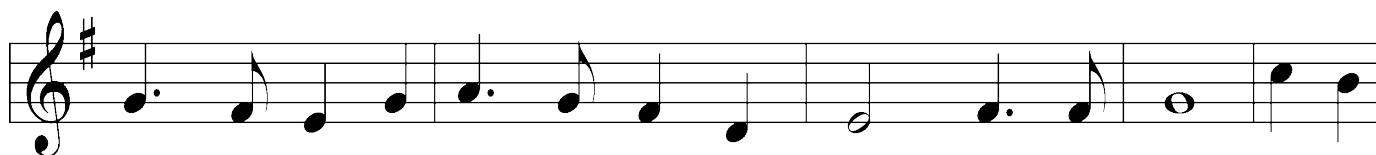

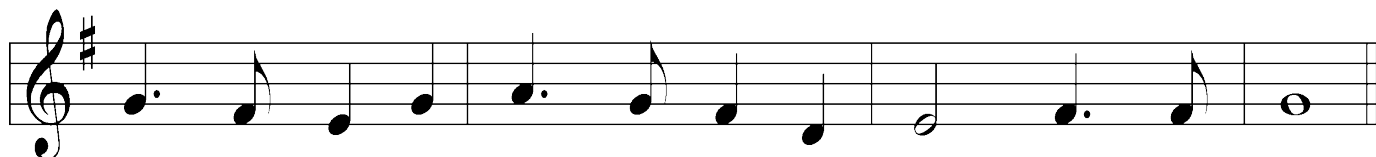

Old Testament Reading: Ruth 1:1-19

(Ruth's loyalty to widow Naomi)

In the days when the judges ruled there was a famine in the land, and a man of Bethlehem in Judah went to sojourn in the country of Moab, he and his wife and his two sons. The name of the man was Elimelech and the name of his wife Naomi, and the names of his two sons were Mahlon and Chilion. They were Ephrathites from Bethlehem in Judah. They went into the country of Moab and remained there. But Elimelech, the husband of Naomi, died, and she was left with her two sons. These took Moabite wives; the name of the one was Orpah and the

name of the other Ruth. They lived there about ten years, and both Mahlon and Chilion died, so that the woman was left without her two sons and her husband.

Then she arose with her daughters-in-law to return from the country of Moab, for she had heard in the fields of Moab that the Lord had visited his people and given them food. So she set out from the place where she was with her two daughters-in-law, and they went on the way to return to the land of Judah. But Naomi said to her two daughters-in-law, "Go, return each of you to her mother's house. May the Lord deal kindly with you, as you have dealt with the dead and with me. The Lord grant that you may find rest, each of you in the house of her husband!" Then she kissed them, and they lifted up their voices and wept. And they said to her, "No, we will return with you to your people." But Naomi said, "Turn back, my daughters; why will you go with me? Have I yet sons in my womb that they may become your husbands? Turn back, my daughters; go your way, for I am too old to have a husband. If I should say I have hope, even if I should have a husband this night and should bear sons, would you therefore wait till they were grown? Would you therefore refrain from marrying? No, my daughters, for it is exceedingly bitter to me for your sake that the hand of the Lord has gone out against me." Then they lifted up their voices and wept again. And Orpah kissed her mother-in-law, but Ruth clung to her.

And she said, "See, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods; return after your sister-in-law." But Ruth said, "Do not urge me to leave you or to return from following you. For where you go I will go, and where you lodge I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die I will die, and there will I be buried. May the Lord do so to me and more also if anything but death parts me from you." And when Naomi saw that she was determined to go with her, she said no more.

So the two of them went on until they came to Bethlehem. And when they came to Bethlehem, the whole town was stirred because of them. And the women said, "Is this Naomi?"

Epistle: 2 Timothy 2:1-13

(A good soldier of Jesus Christ)

You then, my child, be strengthened by the grace that is in Christ Jesus, and what you have heard from me in the presence of many witnesses entrust to faithful men, who will be able to teach others also. Share in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him. An athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules. It is the hard-working farmer who ought to have the first share of the crops. Think over what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in everything.

Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, the offspring of David, as preached in my gospel, for which I am suffering, bound with chains as a criminal. But the word of God is not bound! Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory. The saying is trustworthy, for:

**If we have died with him, we will also live with him;
if we endure, we will also reign with him;
if we deny him, he also will deny us;
if we are faithless, he remains faithful—
for he cannot deny himself.**
