Update from Pastor Brown on 12/1: *Talitha has a smaller left side of the heart but it is not as small as we previously thought, which is a relief. Talitha's mitral valve and her aortic valve both are within the normal window for size, and they will grow. Surgery will fix her aortic arch, and they will also fix the hole between Talitha's left and right atriums. Honestly, Talitha Grace is living up to her name. By the miraculous grace of God, we are in a much better place than we were. Special thanks to the doctors and nurses taking care of us as well.*

Update from Pastor Brown on 12/3: *Talitha has been extubated, and is now at 50% supplemental oxygen, which is standard for a cardiac baby after they have put a breathing tube in. All in all, she is doing great. The team is watching to see if there are any seizures or other brain issues that happen after surgery. Long story short, Talitha is doing amazing, and we are blown away with how quickly she is recovering already.*
