Ascension Church Patio Project – 2026 Fundraising Appeal

In 2024, the Board of Trustees removed the deteriorating bell tower for safety and financial reasons. This left a vacant area previously used for outdoor gatherings, such as our popular “coffee under the trees” events. In 2025, the Patio Committee, under the supervision of the Board of Trustees, developed a plan to revitalize this space. The Voters approved both the project and the funding at the recent December Voters’ Meeting. Visuals of the proposed design are available in the narthex and on the Ascension website. The total project cost is approximately \$235,000, which covers design fees, removal of outdated materials, and new construction. Over half of this amount has already been secured through reserved funds and memorial contributions. The remaining fundraising goal is \$100,000.

"Welcome to GriefShare!"

The GriefShare 13-Week support group at Ascension for 2026 begins Tuesday, February 3 and ends Tuesday, April 28. This year, for the first time, we are meeting Tuesday afternoons, from 1:30-3:30 pm. GriefShare programs are Christ-centered and designed to help all grievers, regardless of religious affiliation (or lack of). Each weekly meeting, a topic particular to grief and grieving is introduced, explored, and discussed. Topics range from "Anger" to "Loneliness" to "Self-Care," and more.

Each session follows the GriefShare format:

- Excellent Videos, featuring respected health-care professionals, ministers, psychologists, and everyday grievers;
- Small group discussions that follow the video and allow participants time to share, support, and apply the new information to their grief journey;
- Guided workbook exercises, filled with valuable information and exercises to help participants navigate their own personal grief journey.

Statistics recently released from the national GriefShare office indicates that there are over 15,000 groups, operating in 8,847 churches with 90,000 leaders! Over 2.4 million people checked out the GriefShare website in the last year.
